AG Frosh: Consumers with Radio Shack Gift Cards Can Recover Unused Funds

Baltimore, MD (Dec. 10, 2015) -- Attorney General Brian E. Frosh today announced that consumers who have gift cards for the former electronics retailer Radio Shack can file claims to recover unused balances.

Marylanders can go to <http://www.olderadioshackgiftcards.com> to fill out and submit a claim form, either electronically or by mail. Consumers may also call 844-794-3477 to have a claim form mailed to them.

"It's not fair that consumers are left with already-paid-for gift cards when a business closes without notice," said Attorney General Frosh. "This claims process will ensure that customers are rightfully reimbursed."

The claims process is part of a settlement agreement previously approved in the U.S. Bankruptcy court in Wilmington, Delaware, and supported by 24 states and the District of Columbia. Founded in 1921, Radio Shack filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection in February, and many of its stores were either sold or closed soon after.

Consumers who file a claim for an unredeemed gift card that they purchased or received as a gift will be reimbursed the outstanding balance on the card. Cards acquired through other means, such as a product exchange, customer service dispute or warranty refund, will likely receive a smaller percentage of the balance of the card.

Claims must be filed by December 2, 2016.

Attorney General Frosh noted that no one associated with this settlement will contact them to ask for personal or financial information or to request any payment. Anyone asked for such information or payment should decline those requests.
