- Subcommittees - everyone who has not already chosen a subcommittee will need to choose one
 - Website
 - AG's website does have task force info there
 - We will not be tasked with creating anything new
 - Can just forward updates to AG staff
 - Maybe add a broader marketing/communications strategy committee
 - One Pager
 - next -step should go to policy and race equity
 - Printed materials
 - Where do we want to target? How can it be created
 - Can likely be done in house
 - Need substantive committees to help with content, where it can be distributed
 - Town Halls
 - Hybrid - listening and info session
 - Get info from community and put face to problems that have been created
 - Gather stories from those impacted
 - Videos, testimonials, etc.
 - Library may be able to assist
 - Target dates? September, October
 - Need infrastructure

- AG has found some technological road blocks
 - Can share problems and potential solutions as we get deeper
 - Some platform/access issues
- Library - hosting programs, events, etc.
 - Recently hosted over ¼ million people
 - State says no zoom
 - Do have access to zoom meeting room with access for up to 1k people
 - What beyond giving keys would need, how can libraries best assist getting out the message?
 - Regional programming
 - Question is what are the goals and expectations so that it can be appropriately coordinated
 - Space for questions to be asked or submitted ahead of time
 - Scheduling
 - Libraries often have tight schedules - constraints we should be aware of?
 - Geographic vs. subject area
 - Earlier sense of dates would make the rest of the process much easier
- Janhae Wallace interested in subcommittee
 - Can call or watch responders live on youtube
 - Also Michael Summers, Tamar Sarnoff, and Chijioke Akamigbo
- Reaching the number of people we need to talk about is not possible in person
- Resources, educational toolkits, etc.
 - Different types of town halls may be beneficial
 - What's happening on those courts?
 - Currently not one united court-platform
 - Various differences in jurisdiction
 - Mechanics differ
 - How to help navigate processes
 - Or subject-matter focused
 - Less geographically focused
 - Could potentially be a hybrid format

- Life and health planning wanted to use these sessions to get feedback to inform their work
 - Why are some things used, why aren't others used
 - Maybe make recommendation with two clear options
 - Geographic option
 - Substantive option
 - Start with end and work back - what are we trying to achieve in these committees
 - What should we fixate on?
 - Understanding the resources that are available to them
 - Basic education about why they need certain resources
 - Why would someone need a will?
 - Why would someone need a power of attorney?
 - What gets achieved through other means vs. what can be done with town halls and people come together?
 - How do town halls fit into a larger context?
 - Marketing and strategy group
 - Everyone should be signed up to at least one subcommittee by next meeting
 - Also the option of bringing different groups together - faith, youth, etc.
 - Might be necessary that they are by topic, otherwise it may be too unwieldy
 - Pre-registration? - survey to collect what sort of info those groups are looking for
 - May need to offer state-wide topical
 - May be permission issues with recording - everyone on should know
 - Send along any potential expenditures
 - Must be spent by end of december
 - Should have something submitted by Friday
 - Brief description of what costs may be, range, etc.
 - Who would be spending that money?
