- Goal to make public clear of our goals and results
- Good to keep other committee's with community engagement interests in step with us
- Reena - Where are we now
- Executive Director of Access to Justice Commission and Vice Chair of Task Force
- Next wave of COVID will be justice ramifications
- Courts have been operating by emergency only and are about to be swamped with consumer, eviction, life planning issues
- The public is far less familiar with issues in civil justice system than criminal
- These problems are highly likely to spike
- Urgency
- Brought together many different stakeholders
- Federal delegation
- Designees from maryland state government
- Others including those in the legal sphere and not
- Adoption of race-equity lens
- Should be working with race-equity lense with regard to problems and solutions
- Solutions should consider those at the margins
- This is a support committee
- Will create our own work
- But will provide support/guidance to other substantive subcommittees

■ Eastern shore has their own concerns/issues on race

- Should look for someone in that area
- Each county has census committee and a chair
- Kristin volunteered to speak to people on eastern shore, western maryland, and southern maryland
- Also need language access
- How do we do this without technology access
- People will need to engage with courts remotely
- May need a digital component in terms of communications
- One-pager
- Committee has been charged with putting out one page document to be disseminated to public
- Editing
- Currently doesn't address racial equity too much
- This is not necessarily the thing that will be disseminated
- More of a statement of goals for public facing image
- May be better to add some specifics
- Paragraphs should end with "the task force will do X"
- Try to make language more easily digestible
- Make comments as you see fit
- Is there a mechanism for who to contact after getting this info
- Will call local folks, will there be a general contact number for outreach
- Include subtitles with hyperlinks to useful pages
- Lots of organizations provide services - no single way to centralize
- A2J has tried to centralize some of the info on their website
- May need to consider pathways for people to access info related to covid
- Governor has referred people to call 211 for info, etc.
- Aleithea, Talley, Kristin - work on editing document for next meeting
- Public relations generally, how to get word out
- Previously discussed oped
- Other means of reaching people who do not read papers
- Pamphlets for folks who are not media savvy or engaged in social media
- Social media
- Town halls
- Geographically what and where that would be
- Radio and TV
- Will be hard to get paper in people's hands
- Maybe in this area we may need to have a subcommittee to drill down on how to get info in people's hands
