 - 1. May be best to put funds on the front end- prior to suit being filed

 - 1. Specifically providing notice to tenants as early as possible
 - v. Funding online forum for neighborhoods
 - 1. Using Zoom and experts advice; NextDoor
 - vi. Consider NY Triage Model
 - 1. Divide tenants based on specific issues
 - 2. Day-of services: volunteer attorneys work with tenants; onsite ADR; eviction prevention
 - b. Effort to promote resources
 - i. Those that already exists and new ones
 - ii. Crucial: getting information to people early on
 - 1. Look at statutes-- notice requirements
 - c. Consumer Committee guest
 - i. Provide support for those who have been sued; during lawsuit; and post-judgment
 - ii. Micro-site to deal with debt issues
 - iii. Create a Hotline with the Consumer Committee? (in future)

- 1. Similar to HOPE Hotline for Housing, but for debt collection
