- Need people to host/lead discussion and answer questions
  - Greg Countess
- Main message: go to court
  - Contradicts with health hazards must address both issues
- Provide guidance through the court process
- Safety Protocols in District Court
  - Inconsistent implementation of health and safety protocols and no uniform enforcement of protocols
    - Masks not worn
    - Occupancy limitations not being obeyed (ex- elevator limits)
    - Courts scheduling over the 20 case limit
    - Courthouse staff testing positive for COVID
    - Issues with the ability to communicate privately with clients/witnesses exacerbated
    - Communal resources being used- tables, pens
    - Issues with taking temperatures- no available bailiffs; temps high due to the heat; whether thermometers are accurate
    - Scheduling based on possible assumption that litigants will not appear
  - Who can bring attention to these issues?
    - AG?
    - Make recommendation some type of accountability measure to be put in place (ideas- public can report complaints; AG spot-checking; routine reporting)
    - Especially with higher case volumes coming in September
- Calls for Special Session
  - Request for AG Opinion in the process
- Long-term legislation recommendations
  - o Outline needed by Sept. 17
  - Break down eviction process, perform research & decide what recommendations have appeal
  - Create resource to obtain feedback from Committee about recommendations
