 - a. (1) Make homeowners property tax credit automatic
 - *i.* Leading recommendation
 - ii. No application process or deadlines to miss
 - iii. Research needs
 - 1. Do other states have information about property tax credit data readily available?
 - iv. Concerns
 - 1. Any additional costs associated?
 - 2. Note: that tax credits have already been factored into the state's budget for all those whom should be receiving it
 - b. (2) Review and restructure foreclosure mediation laws to make them more effective and able to handle increased volume
 - i. Summer study
 - 1. Recommend objectives of study
 - 2. Create a more holistic process for homeowners
 - 3. Suggestion of granting two mediation dates?
 - ii. Opt-out > opt-in processes
 - iii. Mediation currently has no postponements/continuances
 - c. (3) Larger individual exemption for equity in home for bankruptcy and debt collection proceedings
 - i. Research needs
 - 1. Exemption for equity amounts in surrounding states
 - ii. Currently
 - 1. Tenants by Entirety: spouse entitled to total equity
 - 2. Tenants & Joint Tenants: entitled to \$26K

- a. Very low compared
- iii. Proposale
 - 1. \$250k?
 - a. Would benefit: Baltimore city residents, rural residents, homes without a lot of land
 - b. Based on estate case law precedent

 - a. Implementation of state rental assistance program (long-term sustained rental assistance)
